<sup>1</sup>Requires one center to be licensed within 190 days of the effective date of the act provided there has been at least one qualifying applicant. Provides that within two years after the effective date the Department of Health is required begin accepting applications for two additional compassion centers; and that within three years after the effective date, if fewer than three compassion centers are licensed, the department is required to begin accepting application.

<sup>2</sup>Requires facilities to have at least one security alarm system for each location, planned measures to deter and prevent the unauthorized entrance into areas containing marijuana and the theft of marijuana, as well as a draft employee instruction manual including security policies, safety and security procedures, personal safety and crime prevention techniques.

<sup>3</sup>Allows the Department of Health is to grant an ID card to a person if the Department determines the offense was for conduct that occurred prior to the enactment of Rhode Island's medical marijuana legislation, or that the person was prosecuted by an authority other than the state for acts that are protected by Rhode Island's medical marijuana statutes .

<sup>4</sup>Provides that an individual will not be disqualified from serving as an employee if the individual has demonstrated to the Commissioner of the Department of Health and Senior Services clear and convincing evidence of rehabilitation. When making a determination, requires the Commissioner to consider: the nature and responsibility of the position which the convicted individual would hold, has held, or currently holds; the nature and seriousness of the crime or offense; the circumstances under which the crime or offense occurred; the date of the crime or offense; the age of the individual when the crime or offense was committed; whether the crime or offense was an isolated or repeated incident; any social conditions which may have contributed to the commission of the crime or offense; and any evidence of rehabilitation, including good conduct in prison or in the community, counseling or psychiatric treatment received, acquisition of additional academic or vocational schooling, successful participation in correctional work-release programs, or the recommendation of those who have had the individual under their supervision.

<sup>5</sup>Individuals convicted of one Class A or Class B felony for the manufacture or delivery of a controlled substance in Schedule I and II on or after January 1, 2006, may be issued a grow site registration card five years after the date of conviction. Individuals convicted more than once may not be issued a grow site registration.

<sup>6</sup>When applying for a permit, New Mexico requires the submission of a number of items not required by other states. Those items unique to New Mexico are: a description of the means the private non-profit shall employ to make qualified patients or the primary caregiver aware of the quality of the product; a description of the means the private non-profit shall employ to safely dispense the marijuana to qualified patients or the qualified patient's primary caregivers; a description of ingestion options of useable marijuana provided by the private non-profit entity; a description of safe smoking techniques that shall be provided to qualified patients; a description of potential side effects and how this shall be communicated to qualified patients and the qualified patient's primary caregivers; a description of the private entity's means for educating the qualified patient and the primary caregiver on the limitation of the right to possess and use marijuana; a description of the packaging of the useable marijuana that the private non-profit entity shall be utilizing, including a label that shall contain the name of the strain, batch, quantity and a statement that the product is for medical use and not for resale; a description of the private non-profit entity's confidential sale records, ensuring that quantities purchased do not suggest re-distribution; both clients and the department shall have access to this information at any time; and a description of the private non-profit entity's policy on the right of the entity to refuse service.

<sup>7</sup>Individuals convicted of more than one felony offense, trafficking a controlled substance, or selling to minors are prohibited from serving on boards or working for entities. Individuals with one felony offense that is not a conviction for trafficking a controlled substance or selling to minors may serve on a board or work for an entity five years after the final completion of a sentence.

<sup>8</sup>A number of qualifications are unique to New Mexico. Those qualifications are: the development of distribution criteria for qualified patients or primary caregivers appropriate for marijuana services, and requires the qualified patient's or the primary caregiver's distribution criteria to include a clear identifiable photocopy of all qualified patient's or the primary caregiver's registry identification card served by the private entity; and plans for the development, implementation and maintenance of an alcohol and drug free workplace program.
