

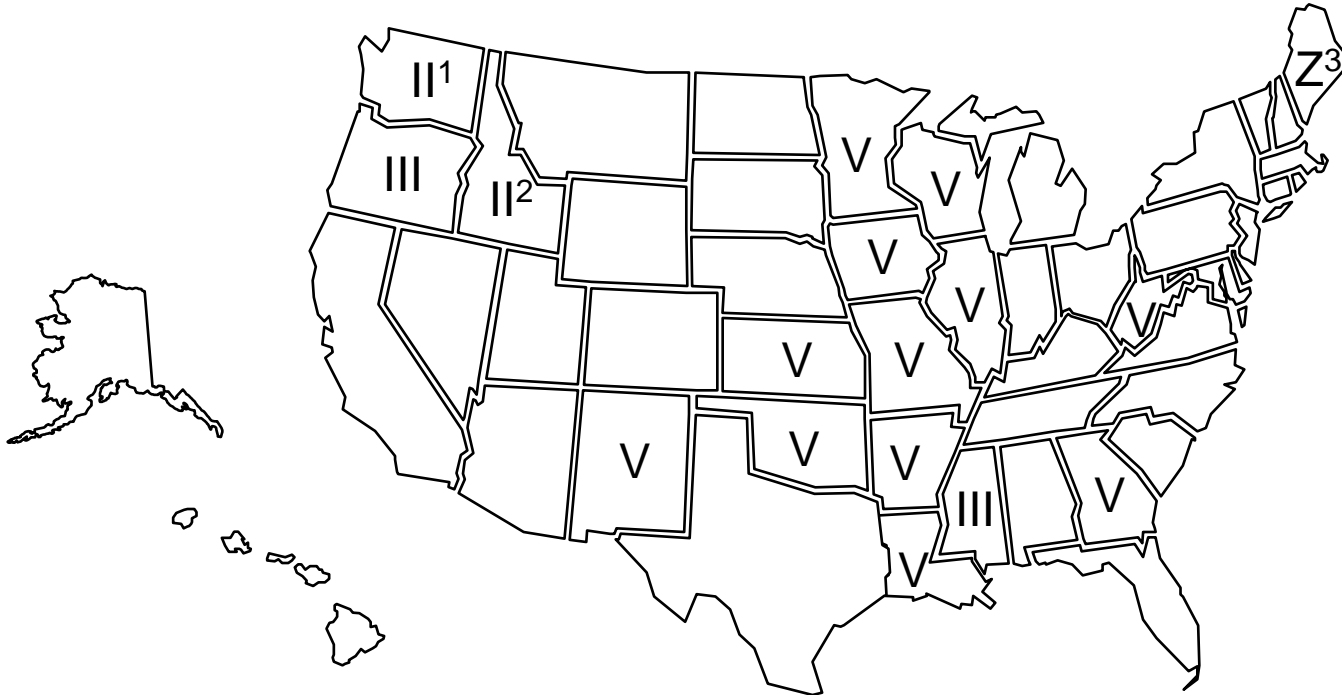
# States That Schedule Pseudoephedrine

# States That Schedule Pseudoephedrine



1. Washington exempts any drug or compound containing pseudoephedrine that is prepared for dispensing or over-the-counter distribution and is in compliance with the Federal Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act and applicable regulations.
2. Idaho exempts products that are prepared for dispensing or over-the-counter distribution, “unless such substance is possessed, delivered, or possessed with intent to deliver to another with the intent to manufacture methamphetamine, amphetamine or any other controlled substance”.
3. An individual must possess a quantity of more than 9 grams of ephedrine, pseudoephedrine or phenylpropanolamine or their salts, isomers or salts of isomers, either alone or in combination with other ingredients, in dry or solid non-liquid form for the substance to be considered schedule Z.

States may create exemptions for specific products , or specific types of products. For more information about exemptions that may be included please refer to the statutory compilation “States That Schedule Pseudoephedrine”.
