The start-up costs for Oklahoma's program were \$350,000. On July 1, 2006, Oklahoma's PMP expanded from collecting prescription data on only schedule II controlled substances to collecting data on schedule II, III, IV, and V controlled substances. In addition, beginning in July 2006, Oklahoma's PMP brought data collection in-house. All pharmacies and dispensers are required to submit prescription data directly to the Oklahoma Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control.

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
