SUMMARY OF CATHINONE DERIVATIVES BILLS

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Alabama:

H.B. 91 – indefinitely postponed as of 6/1/2011

S.B. 117 – died in the basket 5/31/2011

- adds mephedrone, methedrone, methylone, 3-fluoromethcathinone, 4-fluoromethcathinone, and MDPV to its list of Schedule I substances

Arizona:

H.B. 2510 – passed House; no action since 3/17/2011

- adds MDPV, methylenedioxymethcathinone, and methylmethcathinone to its definition of “dangerous drug” and to the list of Schedule I substances

Arkansas:

S.B. 423 – passed 3/28/2011; effective on date of approval by Governor

- adds mephedrone, methedrone, methylone, 3-fluoromethcathinone, 4-fluoromethcathinone, MDPV, and the generic language to its list of Schedule I substances

Connecticut:

H.B. 6554 – sent to Secretary of State 6/30/2011

- directs the Commissioner of Consumer Protection to designate mephedrone and MDPV as Schedule I substances

Florida:

H.B. 1039 – passed 5/31/2011; effective 7/1/2011

- adds methylone, MDPV, methylmethcathinone, methoxymethcathinone, and fluoromethcathinone to its list of Schedule I substances and provides penalties

Georgia:

S.B. 93 – passed 5/13/2011; effective on date of passage

- adds mephedrone, methylone, methedrone, 4-fluoromethcathinone, and MDPV to list of Schedule I drugs

H.B. 199 – passed Senate 3/30/2011; no action since

- adds mephedrone, methylone, methedrone, 4-fluoromethcathinone, and MDPV to list of Schedule I drugs

Hawaii:

H.B. 1085 – passed 6/6/2011; effective 7/1/2011

- adds mephedrone and MDPV to list of Schedule I drugs

S.B. 1305 – no action since 1/26/2011

- adds mephedrone and MDPV to list of Schedule I drugs

H.B. 1217 – no action since 2/3/2011
S.B. 1359 – no action since 1/26/2011
- adds mephedrone and MDPV to definition of “dangerous drugs”

Idaho:

H.B. 119 – passed 3/10/2011; effective on date of passage
- adds generic language to Schedule I drugs

Illinois:

H.B. 1655 – no action since 3/17/2011
H.B. 2089 – sent to Governor 6/27/2011
- adds MDPV to list of Schedule I substances

H.B. 3486 – in committee as of 5/13/2011
- adds generic language to list of Schedule I drugs

S.B. 1034 – in committee as of 5/31/2011
H.B. 3042 – sent to Governor 6/24/2011
- adds mephedrone, methedrone, methylone, 3-fluoromethcathinone, 4-fluoromethcathinone, and MDPV to its list of Schedule I substances

Indiana:

S.B. 57 – passed 5/10/2011; effective 7/1/2011
H.B. 1102 – passed 5/10/2011; effective 7/1/2011
- adds new code section with mephedrone, methylone, methedrone, MDPV and fluoromethcathinone generally as “synthetic cannabinoids” and provides penalties

Iowa:

H.F. 186 – passed House; referred to Senate committee 3/10/2011
- adds “mephedrine” and MDPV to list of Schedule I substances

H.F. 697 – passed House 6/8/2011
- adds mephedrone and MDPV to list of Schedule I substances and provides for penalties

Kansas:

H.B. 2049 – passed 5/18/2011; effective 7/1/2011
- adds generic language to Schedule I and provides for penalties

Kentucky:

H.B. 121 – passed 3/16/2011; effective upon passage
- penalizes trafficking, possession, or manufacture of mephedrone, methylone and MDPV and adds them to Schedule I

S.B. 129 – no action since 2/10/2011

- penalizes trafficking, possession, or manufacture of mephedrone, methylone and MDPV and adds them to Schedule I

Louisiana:

H.B. 10 – no action since 4/25/2011

H.B. 12 – sent to Governor for approval 6/23/2011

- adds generic language to Schedule I

Maine:

H.P. 1147 – passed to be enacted 6/29/2011

- adds mephedrone, methedrone, methylone, 3-fluoromethcathinone, 4-fluoromethcathinone, and MDPV to new code section and provides penalties

Michigan:

S.B. 259 – passed Senate, in House committee as of 4/13/2011

H.B. 4565 – passed both Houses; ordered enrolled 6/30/2011

- amends Schedule I to change “mephadrone” to “mephedrone” and adds MDPV to Schedule I

Minnesota:

H.F. 57 – passed 5/24/2011; effective 7/1/2011

- adds mephedrone, methylone, methedrone and MDPV to list of Schedule I substances

S.F. 1326 – no action since 4/28/2011

- adds mephedrone, methylone and methedrone to list of Schedule I substances

H.F. 1359 – second reading as of 5/2/2011

H.F. 1520 – no action since 4/27/2011

S.F. 1333 – no action since 4/28/2011

- adds mephedrone and MDPV to list of Schedule I substances

Mississippi:

H.B. 1205 – passed 3/11/2011; effective on passage

- adds mephedrone, MDPV and generic language to Schedule I

Missouri:

H.B. 641 – sent to Governor 5/26/2011

- adds mephedrone, methylone, methedrone, 3-fluoromethcathinone, 4-fluoromethcathinone and MDPV to list of Schedule I substances

H.B. 551 – no action since 3/3/2011

H.B. 572 – no action since 3/16/2011

S.B. 354 – no action since 3/3/2011

- adds MDPV to Schedule I

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Nevada:

S.B. 224 – session adjourned; no further action allowed as of 4/16/2011

A.B. 349 – session adjourned; no further action allowed as of 4/16/2011

- directs the State Board of Pharmacy to schedule mephedrone, methylone, methedrone, 3-fluoromethcathinone, 4-fluoromethcathinone and MDPV as Schedule I substances by October 1, 2011

New Jersey:

S.B. 2829 – passed both Houses 6/29/2011

A.B. 3984 – substitute passed; 2d reading 6/16/2011

- adds new code section penalizing manufacture, distribution, dispensing or possession of mephedrone, methylone, methedrone, 3-fluoromethcathinone, 4-fluoromethcathinone and MDPV

New Mexico:

S.B. 134 – passed 3/31/2011; effective on passage

- adds mephedrone, methylone, methedrone, 3-fluoromethcathinone, 4-fluoromethcathinone and MDPV to Schedule I

New York:

S.B. 3322 – substituted by A4769C 6/17/2011

A.B. 4769 – sent to Governor 7/8/2011

S.B. 4460 – no action since 4/6/2011

A.B. 7917 – passed Assembly; referred to Senate committee 6/22/2011

- adds mephedrone and MDPV to Schedule I

A.B. 5456 – no action since 2/18/2011

- adds methedrone, mephedrone, methylone, MDPV and fluoromethcathinone generally and generic language to Schedule I

A.B. 7731 – referred to committee as of 5/16/2011

- creates civil penalty for sale or distribution of mephedrone, methylone, methedrone, 3-fluoromethcathinone, 4-fluoromethcathinone and MDPV

North Carolina:

S.B. 7 – passed 3/25/2011; effective 6/1/2011

- adds mephedrone, MDPV and generic language to Schedule I and provides penalties

H.B. 13 – no action since 1/31/2011

- adds mephedrone to Schedule I

S.B. 77 – no action since 3/7/2011

- adds MDPV to Schedule I and provides penalties

North Dakota:

S.B. 2119 – passed 4/19/2011; effective 8/1/2011
- adds mephedrone and MDPV to Schedule I

Ohio:

H.B. 127 – no action since 3/1/2011
S.B. 126 – no action since 3/22/2011
H.B. 153 – sent to Governor 6/30/2011; becomes law without signature or veto on 7/12/2011
H.B. 64 – sent to Governor 7/6/2011; becomes law without signature or veto on 7/18/2011
- adds mephedrone, methylone, methedrone, 3-fluoromethcathinone, 4-fluoromethcathinone and MDPV to Schedule I

Oklahoma:

S.B. 919 – passed 5/13/2011; effective 11/1/2011
- adds mephedrone, methylone, methedrone, 3-fluoromethcathinone, 4-fluoromethcathinone and MDPV to Schedule I and provides penalties

Pennsylvania:

S.B. 1006 – passed 6/23/2011; effective 60 days after passage
H.B. 567 – laid on table 4/26/2011
H.B. 365 – no action since 4/8/2011
S.B. 909 – no action since 4/4/2011
- adds mephedrone, methylone, methedrone, 3-fluoromethcathinone, 4-fluoromethcathinone and MDPV to Schedule I

Rhode Island:

S.B. 868 – no action since 4/14/2011
H.B. 5403 – no action since 2/16/2011
- adds mephedrone, methylone, MDPV, methoxymethcathinone and fluoromethcathinone generally to Schedule I

South Carolina:

H.B. 3793 – no action since 3/3/2011
- adds mephedrone, methylone, MDPV, methoxymethcathinone and fluoromethcathinone generally to Schedule I

Tennessee:

H.B. 457 – passed 5/5/2011; effective 7/2/2011
S.B. 729 – no action since 4/5/2011
H.B. 1890 – no action since 4/28/2011
- adds new code section penalizing production, manufacture, distribution, sale, offering for sale or possession with intent to produce, manufacture, distribute, sell, or offer for sale mephedrone, methylone, methedrone, 3-fluoromethcathinone, 4-fluoromethcathinone and MDPV

S.B. 735 – no action since 4/27/2011
H.B. 1344 – no action since 2/23/2011
S.B. 329 – action deferred 5/19/2011
H.B. 304 – no action since 4/12/2011
S.B. 504 – no action since 3/16/2011
H.B. 529 – no action since 2/14/2011
S.B. 1891 – no action since 2/24/2011
H.B. 1930 – no action since 3/30/2011

- adds mephedrone, methylone, methedrone, 3-fluoromethcathinone, 4-fluoromethcathinone and MDPV to Schedule I

Texas:

H.B. 2118 – passed 6/17/2011; effective 9/1/2011

S.B. 1423 – no action since 3/22/2011

- adds generic language with all but methedrone as examples to Schedule I

Utah:

H.B. 23 – passed 2/25/2011; effective on passage

- adds new code section with mephedrone, methylone, methedrone, 3-fluoromethcathinone, 4-fluoromethcathinone and MDPV included as “listed controlled substances” and providing for penalties

Virginia:

H.B. 1434 – passed 3/23/2011; effective on passage

- adds mephedrone and MDPV to Schedule I

West Virginia:

H.B. 2505 – passed 4/5/2011; effective 30 days after passage

- adds mephedrone and 3,4-methylenedioxypropylone (as “MPVD”) to Schedule I and provides penalties

S.B. 63 – no action since 2/3/2011

- adds MDPV to Schedule I

Wisconsin:

S.B. 54 – passed 6/24/2011; effective 7/11/2011

A.B. 57 – laid on the table 6/8/2011

- provides penalties and adds mephedrone and MDPV to Schedule I

A.B. 74 – no action since 4/21/2011

- creates new code section penalizing manufacture, delivery, distribution or possession of mephedrone and MDPV

Wyoming:

H.B. 62 – passed 2/18/2011; effective 7/1/2011

- adds mephedrone, methylone, methedrone, 3-fluoromethcathinone, 4-fluoromethcathinone and MDPV to Schedule I

United States Congress:

US S409 – hearings held 4/6/2011

US HR1571 – in committee as of 4/15/2011

- adds mephedrone and MDPV to Schedule I

US HR1254 – referred to subcommittee 6/1/2011

- adds mephedrone, methylone, 4-fluoromethcathinone and MDPV to Schedule I
