Grants for PMP's

■ Harold Rogers Grants

- ◆ Began in 2003
- ◆ States have used money to enhance existing programs or begin new ones
- ◆ Has been an influencing factor in the establishing of new programs

American Society for Automation in Pharmacy (ASAP) Workgroup

- Developed new rules-based implementation guide for PMP's
- **Workgroup Members:**
 - ◆ Pharmacy Management System Vendors
 - ◆ Drug Chain
 - ◆ Independent & a Clinic Pharmacy
 - ◆ NASCA
 - ◆ Alliance

ASAP Workgroup

- Narrowed down segments from ASAP base transaction to those needed for a PMP
- Reviewed each data element
- Implementation Guide was thoroughly vetted
 - ◆ Circulated to States w/PMP and States planning to implement PMP

Integrated Justice Information Systems Institute (IJIS) Project

■ PROJECT:

- ◆ Interstate Prescription Drug Monitoring Information Exchange

■ OBJECTIVES:

- ◆ Develop a methodology and a consensual standard for exchange of information among States
- ◆ Minimize the cost and time of automated information exchange

National Alliance of Model State Drug Laws (NAMSDL)

- Sponsored National PMP Conferences

- Model Interstate Compact Working Group
 - ◆ Standard agreement between PMP states in the sharing of data
 - ☞ What information will be shared
 - ☞ Security & Confidentiality
 - ☞ Use of data by each state

- Education Workgroup

U.S. Department of Justice BJA GRANT

■ Develop PMP Program Evaluation Measures

- ◆ Allow for a Formal Statistical Assessment of a PMP Impact
- ◆ Performance Measurements

National All Schedules Prescription Electronic Reporting Act of 2005 NASPER

■ NEW FEDERAL LEGISLATION

- ◆ Foster the Establishment of State-administered Monitoring Programs
- ◆ Establish a set of best practices to guide new programs and improve existing programs
- ◆ **INTEROPERABILITY**
 - ☞ States must have or plan to have ability to share information among bordering states
