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PMP Timeline

1. Agency supports PMP concept
2. Obtain Sponsor for PMP legislation
3. Draft PMP legislation
4. Seek input from Stakeholders
5. Introduce PMP legislation
6. Repeat 3, 4, 5 as necessary

PMP Timeline

7. Apply for Grants
8. Legislation passes
9. Draft and promulgate Rules to supplement legislation
10. Hire Administrator
11. Plan, plan, plan
12. Apply for additional Grants

PMP Timeline, continued

13. Purchase Hardware and Software
14. Develop Forms and Processes
15. Purchase/obtain Databases (DEA, NDC, Dispensers, Prescribers, Zipcodes)
16. Notify Dispensers
17. Begin Data Collection

PMP Timeline, continued

18. Notify Clients (prescribers, pharmacists, law enforcement, etc)
19. Begin to Register Clients – if necessary
20. Begin providing reports
21. Seek Input from Clients & Stakeholders
22. Plan for the Future

OARRS Pre-Legislation

- 2001 - Agency supports PMP concept
- May 2001 Obtain sponsor for PMP legislation
 - Sponsor met with BOP + LE officers
 - Discussed other state laws
- Draft PMP legislation

OARRS Pre-Legislation, cont.

Fall 2001 - Seek input from stakeholders

- Medical - Board and Association
- Pharmacy - Board and Association
- Nursing - Board and Association
- Dental Board
- Retail Merchants
- Law Enforcement (State and Local)
- PhRMA rep.

OARRS Legislation

- Jan 2002 - Legislation introduced in House
- May 2002 – Passed House Health Committee
- May 2002 – Passed House
- November 2002 – Senate Hearings
- December 2002 – Died at end of legislative session

OARRS Legislation, cont.

- Jan 2004 – Legislation re-introduced in House
- May 2004 – Passed House Health Committee
- May 2004 – Passed House
- November 2004 – Passed Senate Health Committee

OARRS Legislation, cont.

- December 2004 – Passed Senate
- Dec 2004 – House concurred with amendments
- Feb 2005 - Governor signed

OARRS Post-Legislation

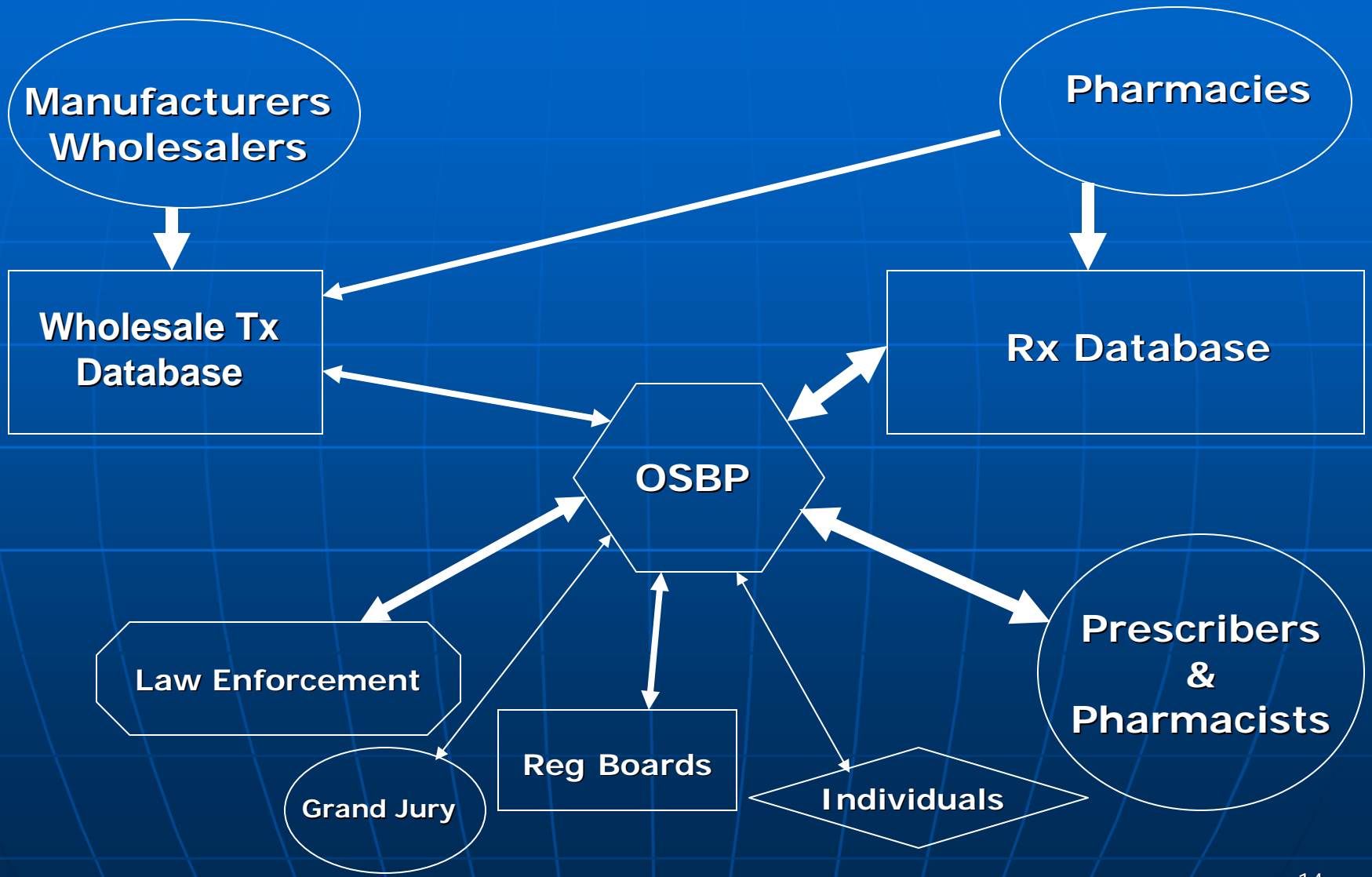
- Summer – Fall 2005 Drafted Rules
- October 2005 – Hired Administrator
- Jan 2006 - Ohio Rules effective
- Winter – Spring 2006
 - Purchase equipment
 - Hire additional staff as needed
 - Communicate with stakeholders

OARRS Future

- May 2006 – Initial Rx data reporting
- June 2006 – Internal testing
- July 2006 – Pilot/external testing
- Aug 2006 – Full implementation
- Fall – Winter 2006 Refinements
- 2007 Enhancements

OAR&RS Budget

- \$180,000 - 2003 Hal Rodgers Grant
- \$350,000 - 2005 Hal Rodgers Grant
 - \$400,000? - 2006 Hal Rodgers Grant
17-applied for-
- \$? - Supplemental Funds from
Pharmacy Board

Cannot charge pharmacist, pharmacy, or
prescriber to support OAR&RS

OARRS Budget

- Future Funding
 - Medicaid
 - Workers' Compensation
 - Grants
 - State Appropriations

OARRS Confidentiality

Data available only to entities that
ALREADY had a right to obtain it
under state law.

OARRS Confidentiality

- Data is not public record
- Disseminate data only per statute
- Record of all requests received
- LE request requires 2 signatures
- Research data – no person's ID
- Destroy data after 2 years
 - Limited exception for current LE cases
