

Highlights – New Mexico House Bill 211

Research is current as of April 26, 2006

1) Schedule V Provisions

- Included in Schedule V is any compound, mixture or preparation that contains any detectable quantity of pseudoephedrine
- The board may exempt pseudoephedrine products from Schedule V provisions if it is determined that the product is formulated so as to effectively prevent the conversion of pseudoephedrine into methamphetamine

2) Who May Sell Pseudoephedrine Products

- Licensed pharmacist
- Pharmacist intern
- Registered pharmacy technician

3) Restrictions on Sale/Distribution and/or Purchase/Acquisition of E/P Products (Quantity Restrictions):

- 9 grams in 30 days

4) Exemptions/Exceptions to Restrictions on Sale/Distribution and/or Possession/Acquisition

- Products dispensed pursuant to a valid prescription

5) Purchaser Requirements

- Purchasers must produce a driver's license or other government-issued photo identification showing a date of birth
- Purchasers must sign a log/receipt indicating date of transaction; name of the purchaser; driver's license number or ID number; name of pharmacist, intern or technician conducting the transaction; and the product and quantity sold

6) Miscellaneous

- Effective date is July 1, 2006
